Murder Suspect Held



On Jan. 10, police found 47-year-old Gordon Rivers, resident of Brandywine Maryland along the 2600 block of Naylor Road, S.E., suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. He was pronounced dead a short time later.

Police arrested and charged 17 year old male with "first-degree felony murder while armed" in connection with the January 10 shooting death.

At a recent hearing, a D.C. Superior Court judge has ruled probable cause exists that the defendant allegedly shot and killed Gordon Rivers last month after a botched robbery attempt inside Rivers' car while it was parked in Southeast Washington. He scheduled a status hearing for June 3.

HELP FROM GLTB COMMUNITY FOR HAITI

In response to the destruction following the magnitude 7.1 earthquake that struck the Caribbean island nation of Haiti on Tuesday, January 12, Unity Fellowship Church of DC held a fundraiser February 20 and raised over \$7,500 towards the effort. Members of Faith Temple donated \$2,500 of the amount raised. The different choirs of the church as well as members of the community participated in this concert fundraiser.

A Video presentation by an Earthquake survivor Elmide Meleance, a U.S. citizen who was in Port-au-Prince during the earthquake, spoke about Haiti's the political and cultural history ties to the U.S. The evening was filled with a musical inspiration from the different choirs and groups. GAY CLUBS RESPOND TO COMMUNITY CONCERNS

Representatives of gay bars Fireplace, Omega and Apex told participants of a DuPont Circle crime summit that they would join efforts to curtail crime and excessive noise in the neighborhood. The DuPont Circle Advisory Neighborhood Commission and the DuPont Circle Citizens Association called the Jan. 26 summit in response to what some of their members called an alarming spike in violent crime in that area during the month of December. Police reports of a carjacking, rape and shooting on and around P Street, between 20th and 22nd streets, all within a few weeks of each other. Police have said they aren't sure if the incidents are linked to nearby clubs, but many P Street residents pointed to frequent fights, including a stabbing, that have been linked to the Pasha. Some nearby residents have observed what they believe are patrons of the gay bar Fireplace selling drugs in the area.

Marriage is Here in DC

The following is information about marriage and domestic partner registration and the most current information about the implementation of the "Jury and Marriage Amendment Act of 2009".

Marriage:

As of March 3, 2010* (*date subject to change pending completion of 30-day congressional review), it will be possible for same sex couples to get legally married in the District of Columbia. Here is some basic information on marriage in the District.

To apply for a marriage license in the District of Columbia you must visit the D.C. Superior Court Marriage Bureau located in H. Carl Moultrie Courthouse, 500 Indiana Avenue N.W., Room # 4485. The office hours are 8:30am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday.

By law, three full days must pass between the day of application to the day that the license can be issued. (E.g. if one files an application on Monday the license cannot be issued until Friday).

Each party to the marriage must bring proof of identity, such as a driver's license, government issued non-driver's identification, birth certificate, passport, or a similar official document. The application requires the parties to identify the name of the officiate who will perform the marriage ceremony. The officiate is any District of Columbia Judge or anyone who is authorized by a religious organization to officiate marriages, such as a minister, priest, rabbi, imam, so long as he or she is registered with the Marriage Bureau to officiate marriages. In addition, the couple should bring the \$35 license application fee and an additional \$10 if you would like a certified copy of the marriage certificate. The fee must be paid in cash or by a money order made out to "Clerk of the Court, D.C. Superior Court".

The \$35 marriage license application fee is waived if you are already registered as Domestic Partners in the District of Columbia. If you are part of a District of Columbia Domestic Partnership, upon marrying, your Domestic Partnership automatically dissolves and you are simply married. If you are part of a Domestic Partnership or Civil Union from another state, the other state's law may require you to dissolve it prior to marrying in the District of Columbia. Check the other state's law about your responsibilities and obligations relating to dissolving that legal relationship prior to marrying. You Must Have Your Receipt To Pick-Up the License. Marriage Licenses are not issued by mail. For more information visit [D.C. Superior Court Web Page](#) or call 202/879-4840.

Marriage/Domestic Partner Recognition from other jurisdictions:

If you are part of same-sex couples that has been legally married in another state or country, or have been registered as a domestic partner in the jurisdictions that have been certified as substantially similar, there is no need for you to register your marriage or domestic partnership with the city.

The opponents, led by Bishop Harry Jackson, pastor of Hope Christian Church in Beltsville, Md., said an injunction was needed to give them more time to organize a voter referendum that could overturn the marriage law. Judge Brian Holeman denied the injunction request on grounds that the court lacked legal authority to block a law approved by the local D.C. government and cleared by Congress through its regular 30 legislative day review, which ends March 3.

MD OUT-OF-STATE SAME-SEX MARRIAGE RECOGNIZED

On February 23, MD State Attorney General released his long-awaited decision on whether Maryland can recognize same-sex couples' valid out-of-state marriage licenses. You also noted action taken by the Governor of New York in 2008 concerning recognition of out-of-state marriages and asked whether a Maryland Governor can issue an executive order concerning recognition of such marriages.

Same-Sex Marriages from Other Jurisdictions in Maryland

This opinion does not concern whether individuals of the same sex may wed in Maryland. The General Assembly has clearly answered that question "no" – an answer that the Court of Appeals has found to be constitutional.

Rather, your inquiry raises the question whether the State may recognize a same-sex marriage *that is valid in the jurisdiction in which it was contracted*. Several states and foreign countries now provide for same-sex marriage under their own laws.

Although two individuals are married in another jurisdiction, their marital status in Maryland can become significant in a variety of ways. A same-sex couple validly married in another state or country may move to Maryland for employment. A same-sex couple validly married in another state or country may vacation in the State – or may stop temporarily in the State while traveling to another destination. A same-sex couple in Maryland may go to another state for the specific purpose of marrying under that state's law, and then return to Maryland. A same-sex couple married in another state may never set foot in Maryland, yet their marital status may have legal significance for others in Maryland.

- **DC has the highest rate of new AIDS cases in the U.S.—12 times the national average,**
- **More than 15,000 people in the Washington metropolitan area live with AIDS,**
- **In DC, 81% of AIDS cases are among Blacks, Nationally, while Blacks represent approximately 13% of the population, they account for 40% of new HIV cases,**
- **HIV is the *third* leading cause of death for Black women, and the *fourth* leading cause of death for Black men, age 25-44,**

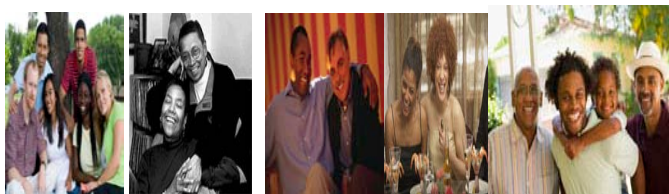

TELLING OUR STORY

The **Census** Bureau is attempting to motivate America's growing and increasingly diverse population to complete and mail back 10-question **census** forms when they arrive in mailboxes March 15-17. The forms are to be returned by April 1.

The **2010 Census**

- A few minutes to answer basic 10 questions about you and those in your household. Everyone gay or straight should be counted. The census counts your primary residence where you live on April 1.
- For every person not counted the local government loses funds because essential services are distributed based on population, such as child care, eldercare, law enforcement, social services, arts and humanities, etc.
- In 2010, same-sex married and unmarried couples will be counted as they report themselves.

Why is it important to answer the census?

- It will say that we do exist, without it some marginalize our existence as insignificant or nonexistent.
- You let decision makers know that same sex identified couples and families are real with needs and characteristics that mirrors the total population.
- Many African American same-sex couples are more likely to have children than other non-minority same sex couples.
- It may provide statistical evidence that African American LG headed families may have needs related to employment, income, disabilities, housing, child care and social services more so than white headed GLTB families.
- Foundations, philanthropists, public and private organizations, won't give support to community requests if you don't have numbers and statistics to prove that you exist and may have special needs.

Having you counted will:

- ▶ Identify and allow for more funding for special programs and services targeting our community to address needs such as child care, adoption, public safety, health disparities, housing, supportive services for the aged, social services, etc.
